What would \$675 million pay for?

TEXAS Grants

- Over the coming biennium, the Coordinating Board anticipates expending \$614,282,952 for a total of 146,451 awards. This will serve approximately 51.2 percent of eligible new students.
- Thus, an additional \$675 million would be enough to **fully fund** TEXAS Grants.

Communities in Schools

- During 2008, CIS served 3.7 percent of Texas' at-risk students using a total of \$55.7 million *state and local* funds.
- If CIS had \$675 million appropriated for the biennium, the program would be able to serve approximately 22.4 percent of the state's at-risk students 6 times the number currently served.
- Yet this budget chose to **cut \$1.3 million in funding for Communities in Schools**, the state's most effective school-based dropout prevention program. Indeed: CIS, which most of y'all will pay lip service to, is receiving a net cut in funding—and this after a TEA-issued report on best practices in dropout prevention cited CIS as the only program that "reported meaningful effects on both reducing dropout and increasing graduation." A \$1.3 million cut after the previous budget appropriated \$300,000 for an effectiveness review that found that CIS is indeed effective. Where are our priorities if we choose to cut funding to what we know works?

Dual Language Pilot Program

- There are no specific numbers to turn to, so I would recommend saying something such as:
- \$675 million would allow the Legislature to create a dynamic dual language program across the state, thus helping to meet our constitutional duty to provide a great education to all students—especially those with limited English proficiency.

Duncan's Jobs and Education for Texans (JET) Grant Program

- Duncan's bill had a limited appropriation of \$25 million for the biennium. The fiscal note does not indicate the assumed number of grantees that will be served.
- Thus, it's best just to say that the JET Grant program would be able to serve **27 times more Texans** than it can serve in the form passed by the Senate.
